a message from our Chief Executive Officer

2023 was a transitional year for Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities; a change of management, change in several procedures, processes, and duties. We also had an upgrade of computers, software, and other technology with a grant from the Regional Development Authority.

In May, we celebrated Habitat's 30th anniversary. The open house was hosted at St. Paul Lutheran Church. Volunteers, partner families, current and past employees and the media came to celebrate. In addition to Habitat turning 30, we celebrated the 20th anniversary of the ReStore and the 10th anniversary of Health & Home. It was a wonderful time to reconnect and celebrate the many accomplishments of the organization over the past 30 years.

We announced our Central City Repair Program, focusing on repairs and accessibility ramps in the central portion of Davenport, with the most aging housing stock. This repair program is partly being funded by a new 4-year grant from the John Deere Foundation. The John Deere Foundation and the employees of John Deere have been long time supporters of Habitat, but this is a million-dollar investment in our Quad Cities community. Part of the grant will fully fund the construction of one affordable Habitat home each year over the 4-year grant. The impact of this grant is huge for the Quad Cities, and we are incredibly grateful for our partnership with John Deere and all our donors and sponsors.

In September, Habitat QC was named as "Charity of Choice" for Russell's 35th Annual Charity Golf Outing. Russell's CEO Jim Russell and President Caitlin Russell, as well as all their employees, are ardent sponsors and volunteers of Habitat. We enjoyed the day outside hosting golfers as they attempted our "Bags for Building" game on hole #1 at Crow Valley Country Club.

We dedicated eight homes in the Quad Cities over the last year, including our last homes on East 6th Street. We completed 21 repairs and installed 22 accessibility ramps throughout the Quad Cities. Thanks to our resolute team of volunteers, Habitat staff, work groups and many subcontractors! We currently have six homes under construction, and we will dig two more foundations in March 2024.

We are continuing to look for opportunities to increase efficiency throughout the organization in all that we do. We were fortunate to receive a grant from the Quad Cities Community Foundation to purchase new scaffolding which will significantly increase the capacity, safety, and efficiency of our homebuilding efforts.

Looking ahead, 2024 will be the year of engagement! We are hosting new quarterly "Habitat Connect" events throughout the Quad Cities over the year. We are excited for these events; not only are they supported by local Quad Cities businesses, but it will be a new way to connect with our volunteers, donors, sponsors and make new friends and connections!

I am extremely grateful for your continued support of Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities, whether you are swinging a hammer, providing lunches, participating on a committee, donating, sponsoring or shopping at ReStore or Health and Home. The support of the mission of Habitat over the past 30 years is because of you. Thank you!

programs at a glance

mission statement

Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities is empowered by God to bring people together to build and renovate homes, to revitalize our community and to restore hope.



homeownership program

We build affordable homes for low income families. These homes are purchased by families with a low down payment, no-interest mortgage with affordable monthly mortgage payments that are based on the family's income. Families are selected based on need, ability to pay a mortgage and willingness to partner with Habitat. Families are paired with a mentor and are expected to accrue "sweat equity" through working alongside staff and volunteers. Families are also required to attend educational classes about budgeting, home maintenance, emergency preparedness, predatory lending, conflict resolution, and more. Applications are taken at select times throughout the year.

home repair program & accessibility ramp program

In February 2019, we began a home repair program. In this program, home repairs and construction of accessibility ramps provide the opportunity for families to regain self-reliance. This program aligns with our mission to restore hope and empowers our low-income, aging, or disabled neighbors. Applications are taken at select times throughout the year.

ReStore and Health & Home

Started in 2002, this program accepts donations of new and gently used building materials, home furnishings, and appliances. In 2012 we began accepting donations of medical equipment and opened ReStore Health and Home. All items are sold at a discounted price and the profits are used to support our local Habitat programs. Our ReStore has helped divert over 16 million pounds of waste from landfills and helps make home repairs and medical equipment more affordable for shoppers.

volunteer

Volunteers keep our programs running and we have a variety of volunteer opportunities available. Opportunities include construction, ReStore, special events and "behind the hammer" activities such as committee membership, administrative help and lunch preparation for our volunteers. We also provide private sponsored build days as an opportunity for team-building for local corporations and organizations.

why we do it

We believe that everyone deserves a decent and affordable place to call home. Every home is a building block. We don't just want individuals to survive; we want neighborhoods to thrive. We believe that focusing on the overall health of our neighborhoods will create a stronger Quad Cities community for generations to come.

It all began in 1993 when a group of volunteers went to Florida to rebuild homes in the aftermath of Hurricane Andrew. When they came home to the Quad Cities, four of those men decided our community needed a Habitat for Humanity. Attendees enjoyed a nostalgic “early days” photo slide show, lots of pictures, news clippings, and other memorabilia. Students from St. Ambrose created a short anniversary video for the occasion as well, which was shown again later in the year at the annual Mr. & Ms. Habitat event.

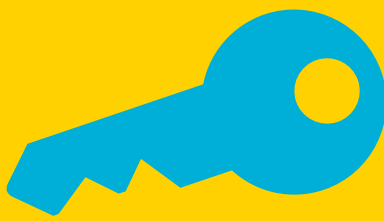

home repair program

Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities has been providing assistance with home repairs for eight years now, beginning with the Neighborhood Revitalization program in the Florecente neighborhood of Moline and most recently an open repair program serving the entire Rock Island County and Scott County areas. These programs have served a vital community need in keeping homes safe and affordable for our low-income neighbors. In 2023, we were able to complete 21 home repair projects, while preparing to launch our newest home repair initiative.

Central City Repair Program

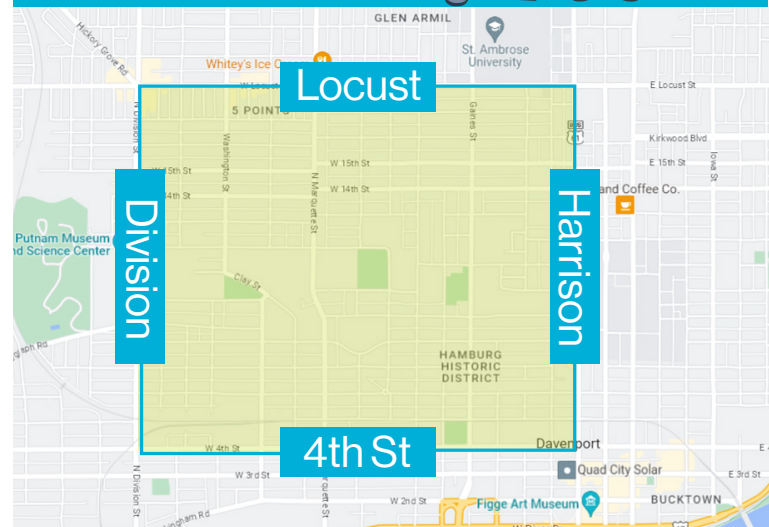


In 2023, we initiated a new neighborhood repair project in Davenport, thanks to the support of the John Deere Foundation. A \$1,000,000 grant over four years will allow us to deploy staff and volunteers to a targeted area and focus our repair efforts to maximize impact. A portion of these funds will also help build one new home each year. This grant is the largest commitment Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities has received to date.

The Central City Repair Program serves low-income residents at or below 80% AMI based on HUD guidelines. Repair projects range from exterior repairs (ex: porches), critical home repairs (ex: minor electrical or minor plumbing), weatherization (ex: windows, gutters, doors), life safety (ex: smoke alarms and fire extinguishers), and accessibility (ramps, grab bars, etc.).

In 2023, we began advertising the program and collecting applications. Repair work will commence in 2024.

accessibility ramp program

Accessibility ramps empower safety, ability, and independence. Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities continues to receive a steady flow of applications for our accessibility ramp program. In 2023, Habitat volunteers completed a total of 22 ramps for low-income aging and/or disabled residents of the Quad Cities, at an average cost of \$2,500 per ramp.

Whether a person is temporarily or permanently disabled, or simply hoping to age in place, a ramp is often the deciding factor whether they can return to or stay in their home. For one man, a ramp was a crucial step in being able to return to his home after a tragic accident that left him wheelchair-bound. With the support of his sister, he applied, got approved, and volunteers moved quickly. His ramp is pictured below with the volunteers who built it. This is the story of just one man, but it represents over 80 people whose lives have been positively impacted through this program since 2018.

After 20 years, we still see new folks making ReStore a destination. Social media followers continue to grow with people looking for that unique item. Through those channels, we've connected an even wider audience with our mission.

With building materials cost still high, ReStore is the first stop for many contractors and DIY'ers alike. Sales have continued to hit record highs many months through the year. The increase in sales

allows ReStore to be a major source of unrestricted funds for Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities.

Donations from local businesses and individuals of new and gently used construction materials, tools, hardware, antiques, furniture, flooring, appliances and home medical supplies have steadily grown in numbers and quality. ReStore has a crew to provide free pick ups, and a dedicated group of volunteers to help process those donations. We are constantly reminded of the tremendous support we receive from the Quad Cities and look forward to 20 more years of success.

Health & Home sold 42 medical beds, 166 wheelchairs, and 409 walkers in 2023.

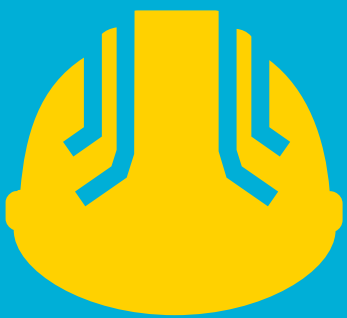

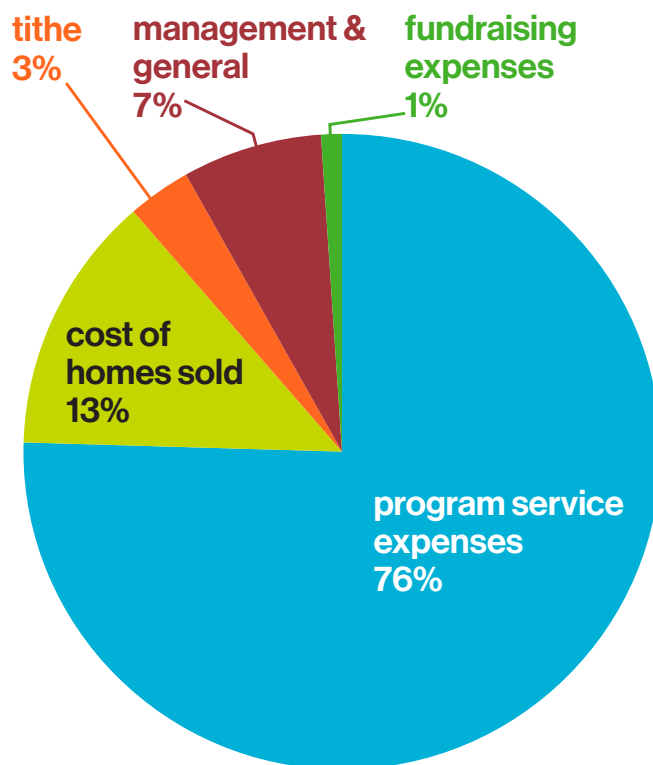
